ASSESSMENT OF STATISTICS ON HOUSEHOLD ESTIMATES AND PROJECTIONS IN SCOTLAND AND STATISTICS ON POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHY IN SCOTLAND

Thank you for your office's various correspondence, outlining the actions that have been taken to address the requirements in Assessment Report 112 Statistics on Household Estimates and Projections in Scotland, and Assessment Report 113 Statistics on Population and Demography in Scotland.

The Board of the Statistics Authority has reviewed these on the advice of the Assessment team and I am pleased to confirm the designation of the outputs as National Statistics.

It is a requirement of the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007 that the Code of Practice must continue to be complied with in relation to the statistics. It is intended to convey a strong and independent endorsement for the statistical publication.

Text that may only be used in publications that carry the National Statistics logo following assessment and designation:

The United Kingdom Statistics Authority has designated these statistics as National Statistics, in accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007 and signifying compliance with the Code of Practice for Official Statistics.

Designation can be broadly interpreted to mean that the statistics:

- meet identified user needs;
- are well explained and readily accessible;
- are produced according to sound methods, and
- are managed impartially and objectively in the public interest.

Once statistics have been designated as National Statistics it is a statutory requirement that the Code of Practice shall continue to be observed.
