ASSESSMENT OF STATISTICS ON PRISONS AND PROBATION

The Board of the Statistics Authority was pleased to see that two of the three outputs reviewed in Assessment Report number 230 Statistics on Prisons and Probation were assessed as complying with the Code of Practice:

- Offender Management Statistics; and
- Safety in Custody.

The remaining output covered by the assessment is subject to the Ministry of Justice implementing the enhancements listed in section 1.5 of the report.

It is a requirement of the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007 that the Code of Practice must continue to be complied with in relation to the statistics. Text that may only be used in publications that carry the National Statistics logo following assessment and designation:

The United Kingdom Statistics Authority has designated these statistics as National Statistics, in accordance with the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007 and signifying compliance with the Code of Practice for Official Statistics.

Designation can be broadly interpreted to mean that the statistics:

- meet identified user needs;
- are well explained and readily accessible;
- are produced according to sound methods; and
- are managed impartially and objectively in the public interest.

Once statistics have been designated as National Statistics it is a statutory requirement that the Code of Practice shall continue to be observed.
