Reasons for breach

Insufficient capacity on the internal web server prevented the loading of data files.

3 Reactions and Impact

4 Corrective Actions Taken (include short-term actions, and long-term changes made to procedures)

The immediate action has been the report of the problem to the DH Digital Communications department who were not aware of the capacity problem. The DH Digital Communications department have since expanded the available capacity by a simple procedure. In the meantime DH statistical staff were taking a manual "workaround" action which led to operational delays.

Going forward we will work with the DH Digital Communications department so our needs are known and that any capacity issues are known about and resolved in advance.
