The release was sent to the pre-release list (PRL) at 09.39 on 15/11/2017 within the 24 hour period, with the usual guidance and warnings (as shown below).

These statistics should be treated as <u>restricted until publication at 9.30 am on Thursday 16</u> <u>November 2017</u>. They are designated as National Statistics: please treat as OFFICIAL SENSITIVE, for named individuals or identified post holders only (on attached pre-release list). They are not for sharing with anyone else or to be used in other documents before publication. If you think you need to discuss and share the figures with anyone not on the circulation list first contact the Departmental Head of Profession for Statistics. Any accidental or wrongful release should be reported immediately and may lead to an inquiry. Wrongful release includes indications of the content or the trend of the figures, including descriptions such as 'higher' or 'lower'.

At 18.29 on the same day, the Secretary of State's speech-writer (on the PRL) forwarded a draft Ministerial speech containing a figure from the release to officials, some of whom were on the PRL but others who were not. The forwarding email was classified 'Official Sensitive' and explained this was because the statistic was on pre-release.

The forwarded email and document was noticed after the release time of 9.30 on 16/11 by DCLG Housing and Planning analysts (to whom it had been sent), and reported to the Senior Housing Statistician who reported it to the Head of Profession for Statistics.

Describe the short-term actions made to redress the situation and the longer term changes to procedures etc

A meeting was held with the Secretary of State's speech-writer who forwarded the email to explain the arrangements for granting Pre Release Access, and to reiterate in particular that this means that the contents cannot be forwarded to other officials not listed on the PRL. Work is ongoing with Private Offices and Ministerial teams to ensure that regular reminders are given, and training for new staff is attended, covering the principles and practices of Pre Release Access and the Code of Practice for Official Statistics.
