A table containing a detailed breakdown of inward investment results was provided over email to the Director of Inward Investment and the Managing Director at London & Partners 24 hours prior to publication (9:30am 25/6/18) as part of the <u>pre-release access list</u>. London & Partners are one of our key delivery partners and essential in the production of these statistics in providing intelligence on inward investment products into the UK. Pre-release access allows them to prepare coherent briefing, but not to influence the content of the reporting.

The data provided was not the entirety of the publication which would be released at the official scheduled time, but a London-specific cut.

The Director of Inward Investment forwarded the pre-release to an individual not on the pre-release access list, the Head of Corporate Communications & Public Affairs (at London & Partners) at 11:04am. Following this, London & Partners emailed an inquiry to our media handling representative to ask for any planned DIT press release that would go hand in hand with the main publication.

The Head of Investment at DIT, followed up on this request by emailing London & Partners reiterating pre-release protocols and explaining that anyone with access to the data not on the pre-release list must delete it immediately. This response was sent at 6:14pm on the same day. London & Partners acknowledged the response at 6:42pm and apologised for the breach.

### 3. Impact of the breach

To our understanding, due to the small scale of the breach and the individuals involved, there was no significant impact of the breach. Moreover, as the data provided to London and Partners for pre-release access included only London relevant data any potential impact of the breach would have been substantially reduced.

## 4. Corrective actions (taken or planned) to prevent re-occurrence

The immediate reaction to the breach was an instruction for anyone not on the pre-release access list to delete the data in question and a reminder of the protocols involved in pre-release.

Despite a pre-existing strong warning in the cover email, we intend to make the warning clearer and more explicit. The existing wording was as follows:
